Motion by Commissioner Kubicek, seconded by Commissioner Schultz to refer the Beaver Lake drainage problem to the Environmental and Planning Committee. Ayes all.

Motion by Commissioner Ebeling, seconded by Commissioner Kubicek to approve of the U. S. Fish & Wildlife Service land purchase of 20 acres in Summit Township from Harold and Ardis Montanye and to authorize the Chairman to sign. Ayes all.

Motion by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Schultz to authorize DeeAnn Pettyjohn and Scott Golberg to proceed with drafting a new Ordinance for body art. Ayes all.

Commissioner Johnson offered the following Resolution, seconded by Commissioner Ebeling:

WHEREAS, under the provisions contained in Minnesota Statutes 446.073 the TMDL grant program was created and funds appropriated; and

WHEREAS, a TMDL study has been approved by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency has determined the Bixby Sewer Project is necessary to meet the wasteload reductions required by the TMDL, and

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Steele County-Bixby Subordinate Service District has the legal authority to apply for the grant, and the financial, technical, and managerial capacity to ensure proper construction, operation and maintenance of the project for its design life.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon approval of its application by the PFA, the Steele County-Bixby Subordinate Service District may enter into an agreement with the PFA for the above-referenced project, and that the Bixby Subordinate Service District certifies that it described in the Compliance listing of the grant application.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the chair of the Steele County Board of Commissioners or their successor in office, are hereby authorized to execute such agreements, and amendments thereto, as are necessary to implement the above project on behalf of the Steele County-Bixby Subordinate District.

Upon the vote being taken, five Commissioners voted in favor thereof, none absent and not voting. A copy of the Resolution is on file in the Auditor's Office.

Motion by Commissioner Schultz, seconded by Commissioner Johnson to authorize the Chair to sign an Agreement stating that we will abide by contract laws regarding the TDML federal grant. Ayes all.
